- Canada's first fully integrated provincial health system
- Serves a population of ~ 4 million Albertans over 661,848 km

 - Achieve a high quality, appropriate, accountable and sustainable health system







Alberta Health Services (AHS)

- Patient-focused, quality health system accessible and sustainable for all Albertans
- 96,100 employees
- 8,400 physicians
- 17,600 volunteers
- Programs and services offered at over 400 facilities (hospitals, clinics, continuing care facilities, mental health facilities and community health sites)
 - 100 acute care hospitals
 - 5 stand-alone psychiatric facilities
 - 8,230 acute care beds
 - 22,533 continuing care beds/spaces





Operational Challenges


Current State:
