


National eHealth record system launched July 2012

Our NRC at a glance (as at October)





Driving Vendor Uptake of AMT & SNOMED CT



- Collaboration with their customers and agreement on a set of common requirements
- Addressing the sector through direct and individual contact with GP, Community Pharmacy and Acute System Vendorsincluding account management and prof services support
- Collaboration with the individual vendors on structure and processes that would work for them; such as workshops and consultation.
- Technical support and tooling.
- Specific contractual arrangements including financial incentives.

AMT Model – high level



Identifies the Medicinal Product

Medicinal Product
(MP)
e.g. Amoxycillin

Medicinal Product Unit of Use (MPUU)
e.g. Amoxycillin 500 mg capsule

Medicinal Product Pack
(MPP)
e.g. Amoxycillin 500 mg capsule, 20

Identifies the Trade Product

Trade Product (TP)
e.g. Amoxil

(MPUU)
e.g. Amoxil 500 mg capsule: hard, 1
capsule

Trade Product Unit of Use

Trade Product Pack *(TPP)*e.g. Amoxil 500 mg capsule: hard, 20

Containered Trade Product Pack (CTPP)
e.g. Amoxil 500 mg capsule: hard, 20 capsules, blister pack
